Gary A. Rubin is a Counsel in the firm's Dallas office.

Mr. Rubin represents individuals, companies, boards, and committees in parallel proceedings including complex litigation, class-action and multidistrict litigation, trials, and internal investigations arising under anticorruption, antifraud, antitrust, bankruptcy, contract, commodities, consumer-protection, products-liability, and securities laws.

He also provides advice regarding crisis management and related strategic communications. Many of Mr. Rubin's matters involve significant overseas components involving conflicts of laws, including data-protection, labor, and secrecy laws, and logistical difficulties. In addition, Mr. Rubin provides regulatory advice to businesses on complying with anticorruption laws.

Mr. Rubin's experience includes representing a financial institution in breach-of-contract litigation against a hedge fund regarding a loan securitized in part by the proceeds of single-name credit-default swaps. He also has represented medical-devices manufacturers in multidistrict products-liability litigation related to implants.

Mr. Rubin represented a financial institution in class-action litigation related to benchmarks and derivative financial instruments following government-enforcement proceedings. He also represented a financial institution in a litigated adversary proceeding against debtors and the official committee of unsecured creditors in jointly administered bankruptcy cases.

Additionally, his experience includes representing a contract market and clearing organization in administrative-review litigation against the Commodity Futures Trading Commission related to Dodd-Frank rulemaking. He represented a swap dealer in parallel price-manipulation investigations by the CFTC and the Department of Justice, and a follow-on investigation by the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority, related to the benchmark for valuing cash-settled interest-rate swap options.

Mr. Rubin also represented an automobile manufacturer in parallel Foreign Corrupt Practices Act investigations by the DOJ and the Securities and Exchange Commission related to conduct in Africa, Asia, Europe, and North and South America.

Additionally, Mr. Rubin has conducted an internal investigation on behalf of a medical-devices manufacturer related to allegations of earnings management. He also conducted an internal investigation on behalf of a tactical-communications company related to allegations of misuse of corporate assets by a senior executive. Additionally, he conducted an internal investigation on behalf of a mining company related to allegations of misconduct in China.

Mr. Rubin received his Juris Doctor degree from the University of Chicago in 1999 and concurrent Master of Arts and Bachelor of Arts degrees from Johns Hopkins University in 1996.
